Special Needs Children Seminar

This summer Bon Air Christian Church in Richmond will be hosting a three-part seminar focusing on Special Needs Children. The sessions will be 3:30pm to 4:30pm on June 20, July 18, & August 15.

The purpose of the seminar will be to help educate people on the diagnoses, challenges, therapies, and general assistance needed by children with special needs. As a church we want to respond to both the children and their parents, but often find ourselves not understanding their challenges or how we can respond. While we will include an array of special needs information, special attention will be given to autism, adhd, and other neurological & developmental disorders.

Session 1 will focus on types of developmental disabilities, diagnosis, and overview of early childhood intervention/private treatment options presented by Suzanne Saltisiak, LCSW. Session 2 will look at public school treatment options presented by Cathy Law and Occupational Therapy by Frances Atherton. Session 3 will be a panel discussion of how the public and specifically the church can respond to the needs of these children while integrating them into the church in a positive way.

People from across the Nashville metro area and Middle Tennessee have been greatly impacted by the devastating floods a few weeks ago. Disciples congregations were not spared, as you know. The Christian Church in Tennessee office was ruined, several Disciples churches experienced severe flooding, and every single one of our churches has had members affected.

But while everywhere we turned there was incredible damage, there was also amazing work being done by our Disciples congregations. Disciples-led grassroots feeding programs are ensuring that people who lost their homes can count on a decent meal. Alameda Christian Church, New Covenant Christian Church, Woodmont Christian Church, and Iglesia Cristiana Discipulos de Cristo have reached out to meet the needs of their communities. Eastwood Christian Church kept the doors of its daycare center open longer, and employed additional caregivers, so that parents could join in the immediate relief efforts.

Vine Street Christian Church and the Disciples Divinity House of Vanderbilt University have also been hard at work-- gutting flood-damaged homes and cleaning out the ravaged regional office.

We will have a congregational meeting on June 27 following the 10:45 worship service to consider the following resolution. This resolution is being forwarded to the congregation from the official board.
