Special offering will be collected at special services throughout Advent and Christmas. You can also give to the Christmas Special Offering on Givelify.



ADVENT BOOK STUDY



This Advent, we'll be studying *The Christmas Letters* by Magrey DeVega. Pastor DeVega explores the miracle of the Incarnation from a perspective we don't often highlight during this season: the New Testament Epistles of Romans, 1 John, Philippians, and Colossians. You're invited to read these as your first "Christmas Letters" of the season, and find within them an invitation from God to deepen your understanding of the Incarnation and embrace a fuller commitment to Jesus Christ.

The study will take place over three weeks, with the option of either a Wednesday online study *prior to Prayer & Fellowship* (beginning at 5:30 p.m., using the same Zoom link as Prayer & Fellowship) or a Thursday in-person study (beginning at 10:30 a.m. and meeting in the church library). The dates for the study will be Dec 3&4, Dec 10&11, and Dec 17 & 18. Books are available in the church office.

2025 Ministers Report

It's always a joy to look back over a year in the life of Bon Air Christian Church, and to see all of the beautiful ways the Holy Spirit is at work as we try to live out our mission and grow as disciples of Jesus Christ.

In 2025, Bon Air Christian Church reached out to proclaim the gospel through ministries both familiar (such as an Intergenerational Mission Trip, Vacation Bible School, Trunk or Treat, Parents' Nights Out, and relationships with NAMI, the Bon Air Ministers Association, the Bon Air/Southside Interfaith Trialogue, and Redd Elementary) and new (like Praise 'n' Play, a NA group now meeting at our church, and meeting transitional needs at HomeAgain through a supply drive).

We reached up to worship God, walking with Jesus through the gospel of Luke through the first half of the year; exploring faith questions raised by our Pastor's Class youth over the summer; and reflecting on themes of sharing and worship this fall. We've averaged ~120 in-person in worship each week (~15 in our Saturday worship services, ~27 at our early service and ~78 at our late service, with ~82 during our summer combined Sunday worship service). Those numbers are relatively steady from this time last year. Our online engagement is down slightly from this time last year, with an average of 17 on Zoom and 38 views on our YouTube worship videos. Special services throughout the year marked particular seasons in our life together, as well as particular moments of celebrations, such as the Installation of Rev. Amy Oblinger, the ordination of Rev. Laticia Lee in recognition of her new church ministry, the baptisms of Clorie Metcalf, Maisie Lloyd, and Althea Genadopoulas, and the dedications of Delilah Gilbert, Jude Finnegan-Hosey, and Jack Vaden. In addition to new members by baptism, we also welcomed other new members into the fellowship of Bon Air Christian Church: Jan Jones, Charlie Young, Laura Stankiewicz, Evan Gross, and Amy Oblinger.

We reached in to nurture and grow in faith and love. A Lenten book study and two Pastor's Classes, one for youth and one for adults, offered opportunities for deepened faith. I've recorded 125 in-person pastoral conversations so far this year, in hospitals, homes, assisted living facilities, coffee shops, and the church building – looking back, that's about 35 more than I had reported at this time last year. As a congregation, we have grieved the deaths and celebrated the lives of Will Woolridge, Martha Wright, David Limbrick, Wanda Russell, Kathy Morton, and Russell Nunnally. I've also officiated 7 memorial services and 1 wedding for folks without a church home.

Of course, it's impossible to capture everything, and there is so much faith and fellowship that happens here through shared meals, meal trains, visits, informal conversations – the stuff of life together as a church. I am grateful for it all, and give thanks to God for this congregation where there is always a lot going on in the life of the church!

It's my blessing to serve this "church on a mission." I am grateful for these past 4 and a half years with you, and I thank God for each of you.
